This February, EPL will begin offering mobile hotspots to circulate to patrons. A mobile hotspot, or MiFi, is an easy to use unit that allows devices such as phones, tablets or laptops to connect to the internet through Sprint's 4G network. Use MiFi units to do homework, check email, and search for a job or anything else you might do on the internet. Great at home or on the road, mobile hotspots allow you to stay connected without using your data plan.

Patrons can check out MiFi Units the same way you would a movie, book or CD on adult cards in good standing only, for a seven-day loan. Visit our website or stop by the library for more information.

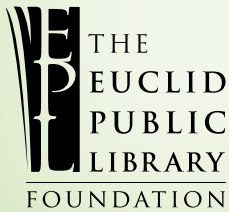
